	FPUA requests \$3,800,000 to construct a Master Lift Station to assist with the primary project of relocating the Water Reclamation Facility (WRF) located on the Indian River Lagoon. The Master Lift Station is needed to transport wastewater from South Hutchinson Island to the new WRF located five miles inland.
B.	Provide location of public infrastructure, including physical address and county of project.
	The WRF is located in St. Lucie County at 403 Seaway Drive, Fort Pierce, FL, 34949 (27.457854, -80.315487). The Master Lift Station will be built at this address to convey the wastewater from South Hutchinson Island to the new WRF, also in St. Lucie County, located at 4515 Energy Lane, Fort Pierce, FL 34981 (27.38666, -80.37741).

	Fort Pierce Utilities Authority, a municipal utility, is currently the owner of the property.
	Is this infrastructure for public use or does it predominately benefit the public?
	The Master Lift Station will predominately benefit the public. Wastewater treatment is a critical service for public health and safety. This specific infrastructure collects wastewater from homes and businesses via gravity mains and then pumps the collected wastewater to the wastewater treatment plant for processing and disposal.

	No, the infrastructure will be utilized as a public benefit and will create economic opportunities for revitalization efforts in the downtown Fort Pierce area. FPUA is a municipal utility provider that serves all Fort Pierce citizens and some St. Lucie County citizens with wastewater collection and treatment. The primary responsibility of FPUA's Wastewater infrastructure is to operate, maintain, and protect the system that collects, treats, and

disposes of sewage generated from domestic and industrial customers within its service area.

The commencement of this project will begin within 12 months of acceptance and be completed within 27 months from date of acceptance. The design phase is anticipated to take 6 months, the permitting phase is expected to take 3 months, and the construction phase is expected to last 18 months.
