The current proposed roadway widening does not account for pedestrian (sidewalk) lighting along the east side of the road. The project will prevent potential safety concerns along the corridor.

This Project consists of the design and installation of 42 Washingtonian pedestrian streetlights along State Road 7 between County Line Road and Pembroke Road. The current proposed roadway widening does not account for pedestrian (sidewalk) lighting along the east side of the road. The project will prevent potential safety concerns along the corridor. This is a major business friendly corridor that serves a multitude of people traveling through various parts of the Broward & Miami Dade Counties. This project will enhance safety for this Transit Oriented Corridor and business district.

Over the past several years, the City of West Park has experienced a significant amount of traffic incidents and complaints involving accidents, speeding vehicles, pedestrians and bicyclists. Last year alone, there were a total of 559 traffic accidents. There were 5 bicyclists hit by vehicles, 10 vehicles verses pedestrians' incidents, 70 hit and run accidents, and 74 safety belt violations. The 2017 Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) Highway Safety Matrix of Florida cities with less than 15,000 residents ranked West Park 25 out of 116 for reported bicycle and pedestrian vs motor vehicle serious injuries and fatalities. FDOT recommends and encourages cities ranked in the top 25%





to support additional education, warning, and enforcement activities. FDOT has identified 5 intersections within the city in need of additional enforcement details due to high bicycle and pedestrian vs motor vehicle accident rates.
