The City of Lake City has secured \$2.3M in EDA funding to repair two hangars and bring the fire system up to FAA standards to provide a safe space for practical application exercises. Additionally, the City's current tenant, HAECO (an aircraft maintenance, repair and overhaul industry) will provide approximately \$280k in materials for practical application facilitation.

2021-2022 Florida Job Growth Grant Fund Workforce Training Grant Proposal – Gateway Regional Technical Aviation Academy

1 A. Provide the title and a detailed description of the proposed workforce training.

The City of Lake City, along with its educational partner, RIVEROAK Technical College (RTC), is requesting funds to construct a 20k-sf training facility that will be home to the Gateway Regional Technical Aviation Academy (GRTAA). The initial phase of the GRTAA will offer entry level programming, allowing an unskilled adult to obtain a career in multiple manufacturing industries, including aviation, in as little as twenty-one weeks while opening the door for a life-long career. The proposed courses to be offered by the GRTAA will be open to all adults as well as dual enrollment high school students with a desire to build occupational skills necessary for employment in a qualified target industry such as aviation and/or manufacturing. The current training model is designed to graduate 128 students annually. The proposed curriculum will teach skills such as sheet metal fabrication with hand tools, pneumatic tools, brake sheets, etc. Additionally, complex problem solving, equipment maintenance, system analysis and evaluation, and critical thinking skills are an important part of this curriculum. Future plans of the GRTAA include the addition of an Airframe and Powerplant certification program, commonly referred to as A&P, which is a highly sought after certificate.

The GRTAA will be built on land at the Lake City Gateway Airport (LCQ) which is a public-use general aviation airport, owned and operated by the City of Lake City within Columbia County. LCQ began life as a U.S. Naval Air Station during WWII to facilitate pilot training. In 1947, ownership of both land and hangars was transferred from the Federal Government to the City of Lake City. Those hangars remain in use today; however, were in need of significant repair. LCQ's current tenant and one of Columbia County's largest employers, HAECO Americas, has invested over \$2M to bring two of the hangars up to modern code. The City and County governments have partnered together to secure \$2.3M from the Economic Development Administration CARES funding for hangar repairs. The City and County are also finalizing two additional applications through DEO's CDBG program for fire suppression upgrades in another two hangars. Increased interest in airport property from prospective companies and the pressing need for skilled workers at HAECO, a Maintenance, Repair and Overhaul (MRO) company, only intensify the need for a training program that could only be offered through an academy such as the GRTAA.

The need for this type of training program extends beyond Columbia County and into the entire north central Florida rural region. The continuing challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic have resulted in the closure of many manufacturing facilities leaving many people unemployed because they lack a four-year degree or underemployed because they lack the skills needed for high-paying, industrial jobs. Included in this application are many letters of support from surrounding counties, partners within CareerSource, and economic development organizations which reflect the urgency to find a long term solution for the hard-working, blue collar folks in our entire region.

1.B Describe how this proposal supports programs at state colleges or state technical centers.

The Gateway Regional Technical Aviation Academy embodies the mission of our partner, RIVEROAK Technical College - to provide opportunities for the development of qualified workers for the job market; to upgrade occupational skills to re-enter, maintain, or advance employment opportunities; and to enable students to become self-sufficient and self-confident, and to encourage students to become highly productive citizens with positive values and a strong work ethic.

Florida's state colleges exist on the concept of a higher education which has flexible boundaries between the college and its community. RTC is a proud partner of #MoveAheadWithAdultEd, a new national campaign enrolling adult learners into career training programs that equip them with skills that lead to jobs paying a family-sustaining wage. The campaign targets the millions of Americans who need to reskill or upskill to re-enter the workforce.

The GRTAA, in partnership with RTC supports our community by preparing its students directly for manufacturing careers. This program will allow students affordable access to practical skills and qualifications needed to secure high-paying, career oriented employment within several growing industries, without the additional concern of obtaining a four-year degree.

The GRTAA will offer practical skills training such as sheet metal fabrication, composite fundamentals and repair, as well as complex problem solving and technical troubleshooting skills.

1.C Describe how this proposal provides participants transferable, sustainable workforce skills applicable to more than a single employer.

Lake City/Columbia County is home to several industrial and manufacturing businesses with workforce demands that would directly benefit from courses offered at the GRTAA. These industries include well respected companies such as:

- HAECO Americas
- Werner Enterprises
- New Millennium
- LKQ North Florida
- DBI Services
- Hunter Panels
- Aerotek
- Amerit Fleet Solutions

In addition to the industries who already call Lake City/Columbia County home, Columbia County Economic Development is in active discussions with multiple companies interested in locating with the North Florida Mega Industrial Park which is adjacent to the Lake City Gateway Airport. The City of Lake City is also in negotiations with a major development group looking to establish a distribution hub within airport property. Courses offered at GRTAA would be an attractive incentive available to these businesses.

1.D Describe how this proposal supports a program(s) that is offered to the public?

RIVEROAK Technical College serves adults, high school and dual enrollment students. Admission is open to adults who are least 16 years old and not presently enrolled in a secondary school. RTC also cooperates with private industry through continuing education programs, such as the Gateway Regional Aviation Academy, who are interested in RTC's efforts to produce quality graduates.

1.E Describe how this proposal is based on criteria established by the state colleges and state technical centers.

The mission of the Florida College System is to provide access to high-quality, affordable academic and career educational programs that maximize student learning and success, develop a globally competitive workforce and respond rapidly to diverse state and community needs.

With an award of this Florida Jobs Growth Grant application, Lake City will construct, furnish, and equip a state of the art, *high-quality* training facility which includes a computer lab and practical application lab.

Skills such as sheet metal fabrication are a critical component of the *career educational programs* included in the curriculum of the GRTAA. Careers in maintenance, repair and overhaul of aircrafts as well as industrial manufacturing are identified as Qualified Target Industries by Enterprise Florida. The proposed program prepares students for these industries.

The GRTAA addresses an immediate need to industries throughout the region, providing a *rapid response* to the ever-changing, *community need* to provide entry level training for growing business that can be completed in weeks instead of years. The proposed courses will serve individuals, communities, and the state with a low-cost, high-quality educational opportunity that will train workers for high-wage and high-demand occupations.

1.G Describe how this proposal will promote economic opportunity by enhancing workforce training.

The mission of the Columbia County Economic Development Department is to foster a strong local economy and vibrant community by promoting a favorable business environment to attract private capital investment and increase employment opportunities.

The concept of the Gateway Regional Technical Aviation Academy is a direct result of input from existing industries within our community who have challenges hiring skilled workforce, hindering their ability to grow their businesses. The addition of the GRTAA will give potential companies the confidence to recruit workers with the practical skills needed in many industries. The courses

provided will also allow those struggling due to COVID related unemployment or minimum wage jobs to secure high-wage jobs that can support a family.

The GRTAA will offer two courses with basic and advanced training in both; Interiors Training includes the maintenance and repair of the internal components of an aircraft is a 13-week course. Structures Training includes advanced sheet metal skills, tooling, etc. is a 21-week course. The current curriculum and training outline allows for 48 Structures students and 80 Interiors students to be trained annually. It is anticipated that we will incorporate dual enrolled high school students by year two of the program, essentially doubling the capacity of graduates.

Using JobsEQ to study the impact of adding 128 employees with skills associated with Structures and Interiors training, reveals a significant impact on our local economy:

Section 302. - General powers and duties.

- (a) All powers of the city shall be vested in the city council, to be also known as "council," except as provided by law or this Charter.
- (b) Three (3) councilmembers shall be considered a quorum and may carry out all functions according to law as if all members were present.
- (c) At the first council meeting after each regular city election and annually thereafter, the council shall elect one of its members as vice-mayor. The mayor shall preside at meetings of the council and shall be considered a member of the council, shall be recognized as head of city government for all ceremonial purposes, by the governor for purposes of military law, for service of process, execution of contracts, deeds and other documents and agreements with other governmental entities or certifications to other governmental entities. He shall annually prepare a state of the city message, prepare an annual budget message, set forth the agenda for all meetings of the council, name committees of the council and appoint members of the city boards with the approval of the council. He shall have no other administrative duties except as required to carry out the responsibilities herein. The vice-mayor shall act as mayor during the absence or disability of the mayor. In case of the death, resignation or removal of the mayor, the vice-mayor shall serve as mayor until the next regular or special election when the office shall be filled. In case of the death, resignation or removal of the office of mayor, the council shall elect one of its members to serve the unexpired term of the vice-mayor.
- (d) The council shall have the authority by ordinance to set the annual salary of the mayor, councilmembers and its members.

This letter is to endorse Columbia County Economic Development's efforts to implement an avionics training program to assist in serving the workforce needs of Hong Kong Aircraft Engineering Company Limited (HAECO). The Suwannee County School District (SCSD) and RIVEROAK Technical College (RTC) recognize the workforce demand for aircraft maintenance in the service region. As the Pandemic devastated the airline industry for several months and had a detrimental impact upon HAECO and its workforce, the SCSD and RTC are excited and optimistic in Columbia County's plan to support the revitalization of HAECO and develop an aviation technical academy through procurement of several grants.
