In the ever growing and expanding world of Information Technology, employers are faced with an almost universal challenge... finding a qualified and ideal employee.

The solution – stop trying to “find” talent and start “growing” talent.

Inspired Technologies in cooperation with Career Source Capital Region, Lively Technical Center, Leon County Schools, Wakulla County Schools, and Gadsden County Schools introduces SHOP2.0, the first ever apprenticeship and on the job training model for Information Technology for North Florida.

Our goal is to provide high school students and adults with the ability to start in entry level positions with the ability to advance further in their careers, without taking on massive debt. Employers are looking for individuals who not only have the necessary qualifications/certifications, but also have hands on experience. Until now, most technology companies would only entertain potential employees who possessed a 4-year degree, but as we have seen, this standard is not sustainable nor is it practical.

SHOP2.0 changes this mindset and gives people the opportunity to have a high paying career and skill sets that will benefit them for life. Not only are we giving people the chance for a better life, but we are engaging with them at a critical point in their lives. Often these individuals possess the aptitude and attitude to succeed, but aren't given the chance, whether that is a lack of money to pay for school or the lack of hope in a better future. To break this cycle, we must provide people with a hand up and not just a hand out.

Through private and public partnerships, we can make a difference in the lives of our students and adults by showing them that they have options, and clear paths to success.

For High School Students: A pre-approved State of Florida Department of Education curriculum is introduced at the 11th grade or 12th grade level to a pre-approved/selected class of no more than 5 students. Each semester a block of instruction will be taught and at the end of the course a certification test administered. For the student to continue in the program, each certification test must be passed with a 75% grade. Students will be required to maintain an average 3.0 GPA and cannot receive any criminal or school related infractions.

Following the completion of each course/phase the Certification Test for the subject would be administered.

Upon Graduation, students can continue their education at a school of their choosing and continue with the next phases of the program (Entering into Entry Level or Advanced Level Courses at Lively Technical School).

Students over the age of 18 and meeting the employment requirements of Inspired Technologies can be placed in a paid apprenticeship/internship program at Inspired Technologies while completing the next phases of the program; or if they choose, can become full time/part time employees of Inspired Technologies and continue working. Apprentices/Interns must be able to pass a level 2 background check, drug screen, and CJIS Level 4 awareness training to be considered for employment. Apprentices/Interns working part time will be paid an hourly rate of \$10.50 and cannot work over a 30 hour work week.

For College Students and Non-Degree seeking Adults: A pre-approved State of Florida Department of Education curriculum program will be implemented and pre-approved/selected class of no more than 5 students at one time. Each semester a block of instruction will be taught and at the end of the course a certification test

administered. For the student to continue in the program, each certification test must be passed with a 75% grade. Students will be required to maintain an average 3.0 GPA and cannot receive any criminal or school related infractions. If students have completed and received certification in a course, they may advance into the next course or phase.

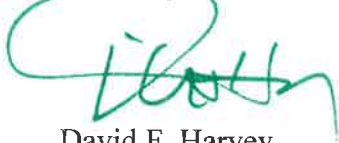

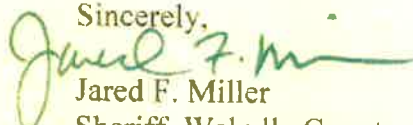
