

### Program Overview

In the 2022 session, the Florida Legislature passed House Bill 7065 which directed the Florida Department of Commerce (FloridaCommerce) to award grants to organizations that assist noncustodial parents who are unemployed or underemployed and have difficulty meeting child support obligations to become self-sufficient and establish a successful pattern of paying child support obligations.
