

### Program Overview

The Reemployment Services and Eligibility Assessment (RESEA) program is designed to identify Reemployment Assistance claimants, including transitioning veterans, who are most likely to exhaust their regular Reemployment Assistance benefits before returning to the workforce. The goal of the program is to prevent and detect improper Reemployment Assistance benefit payments by assessing a claimant's availability to actively seek work and assist claimants by offering reemployment services to get them back to work faster. Failure to participate in the RESEA program may impact a claimant's eligibility to receive Reemployment Assistance benefits.

### Services Provided

Selected claimants are required to receive the following RESEA services through local career centers:

- Program orientation,
- Initial assessment,
- Labor market information,
- Employability development plan, and
- Attend at least one additional career service or work search activity or approved training.

### Program Priorities and Goals

- To improve employment outcomes of Reemployment Assistance recipients and reduce the average duration of Reemployment Assistance benefits through attainment of employment.
- To strengthen program integrity and reduce improper Reemployment Assistance payments through the detection and prevention of such payments to ineligible individuals.
- To promote the alignment with the broader vision of WIOA of increased program integration and service delivery for job seekers, including Reemployment Assistance claimants.
- To establish reemployment services and eligibility assessments as an entry point for Reemployment Assistance claimants into other workforce system partner programs.
- Increase the number of participants referred for WIOA services, to improve program integration and collaboration.
- Create new administrative policies to address any gaps on topics that require guidance and update existing administrative policies to conform to RESEA law and federal regulations.
