

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Employment and Training Program (SNAP E&T)

The SNAP E&T program is funded by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), Food and Nutrition Services (FNS). Florida's SNAP E&T program is designed to assist eligible SNAP E&T participants obtain skills through education, training, or work experience that will increase self-sufficiency and lead to employment. The Florida Department of Commerce (FloridaCommerce), in partnership with the Local Workforce Development Boards (LWDBs), is responsible for the administration of SNAP E&T.

A SNAP E&T participant is defined as an able-bodied adult without dependents (ABAWDs) or Mandatory Work Participant (MWP) who is required to participate in work activities to maintain eligibility for food assistance.

An ABAWD

- Is between ages 18 – 59
- Is not in school at least half-time
- Does not work at least 20 hours a week
- Does not earn at least \$217.50 a week
- Does not have a documented medical limitation
- Does not meet other criteria, outlined by federal regulations, that prevents them from working

The SNAP E&T program offers program participants the opportunity to meet the mandatory work requirements through participation in program activities.

Activities available to program participants include:

- Supervised Job Search
- Job Search Training
- Work Experience
- Education
- Vocational Training
- Job Retention Services

SNAP E&T services are available to mandatory program participants in all Local Workforce Development Areas.
