Situation:

The State Emergency Operations Center is activated to Level 1 (Full) in response to Tropical Storm Ida. All Hurricane Warnings and Watches have been discontinued. At 10am EST, Hurricane Ida was downgraded to a tropical storm with maximum sustained winds near 70mph. Ida is located about 285 miles south-southwest of Pensacola and forecast to make landfall as a tropical storm early Tuesday morning along the Alabama coast. Tropical storm force winds may arrive across the Panhandle as early as Monday evening and Tropical Storm Warnings remain in effect west of the Aucilla River. Rainfall totals of 2-5 inches will be possible, along with storm surge flooding of 2-4 feet along the Florida Panhandle coast, including Apalachee Bay. Isolated tornadoes may also develop in the outer rain bands of Ida away from the center.
