**ORDER OF REEMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE APPEALS COMMISSION**

---

This case comes before the Commission for consideration of an appeal of the decision of a reemployment assistance appeals referee. The referee's decision advised that a request for review should specify any and all contentions of error with respect to the referee's decision, and that contentions of error not specifically raised in the request for review may be considered waived. The Commission has jurisdiction pursuant to Section 443.151(4)(c), Florida Statutes.

On appeal to the Commission, evidence was submitted that was not previously presented to the referee. The parties were advised prior to the hearing that the hearing was their only opportunity to present all of their evidence in support of their case. Florida Administrative Code Rule 73B-21.011 provides that the Commission can consider newly discovered evidence only upon a showing that it is material to the outcome of the case *and* could not have been discovered prior to the hearing by an exercise of due diligence. The Commission did not consider the additional evidence because it does not meet the requirements of the rule.

The Commission's review is generally limited to the issues before the referee and the evidence and other pertinent information contained in the official record. The referee has the responsibility to develop the hearing record, weigh the evidence, judge the credibility of the witnesses, resolve conflicts in the evidence, and render a decision supported by competent, substantial evidence. The Commission reviews the evidentiary and administrative record and the referee's decision to determine whether the referee followed the proper procedures, adequately developed the evidentiary record, made appropriate and properly supported findings, and properly applied the reemployment assistance law established by the Florida Legislature. The Commission cannot reweigh the evidence and the inferences to be drawn from it. Further, absent extraordinary circumstances, the Commission cannot give credit to testimony contrary to that accepted as true by the referee.

Having considered all arguments raised on appeal and having reviewed the hearing record, the Commission concludes that the referee sufficiently followed the proper procedures and the case does not require reopening or remanding for further proceedings. The referee's material findings are supported by competent, substantial evidence in the record. The referee also correctly applied the law in deciding the case.

On appeal to the Commission, the employer argues that since the claimant received pay on August 3, 2018, August 20, 2018, and September 3, 2018, he was not unemployed until after September 3, 2018. Section 443.036(44)(a), Florida Statutes, defines "total unemployment" as, "any week during which [an individual] does not perform any services and *for* which earned income is not payable to him or her" (emphasis added). The use of the word "for," rather than "in," is the result of Florida's use of an accrual method for determining benefit eligibility rather than a cash flow method. For the claimant to have been considered "employed" during the weeks in question, the payments would either have had to have been earned during those weeks, or previously earned but specifically designated to be paid as wages *for* those weeks. Based on the credited testimony, neither of these scenarios is present here.

Florida's reemployment assistance law directs that eligibility for benefits will be assessed on a week-by-week basis. *See* §443.091(1), Fla. Stat. Each week of eligibility begins on Sunday and ends on the following Saturday. Fla. Admin. Code R. 73B-11.011(16). Department records reflect the claimant claimed and was held entitled to benefits for the weeks ending August 11, 2018, and August 18, 2018. Since the evidence in the record does not reflect the claimant performed any services for the employer during those weeks or earned any wages payable for those weeks, the claimant was correctly held to be unemployed for those two weeks and was not overpaid.

The referee's decision is affirmed.

It is so ordered.

### **DECISION OF APPEALS REFEREE**

**Important appeal rights are explained at the end of this decision.**

**Derechos de apelación importantes son explicados al final de esta decisión.**

REEMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE: Whether the claimant was totally or partially unemployed, pursuant to Sections 443.036(44); 443.111(4), Florida Statutes.

**Issues Involved:** OVERPAYMENT: Whether the claimant received benefits to which the claimant was not entitled, and if so, whether those benefits are subject to being recovered or recouped by the Department, pursuant to Sections 443.151(6); 443.071(7); 443.1115, Florida Statutes and 20 CFR 615.8.

**FINDINGS OF FACT:** The claimant filed the initial claim for benefits on 7/30/2018. The claimant's weekly benefit amount is \$275. The claimant was separated from this employer's client company on 7/23/2018. He worked 1 day the week ending 7/28/2018 which was 7/23/2018. He did not earn any wages from this employer from 7/29/2018 to 11/10/2018. He received \$275 in benefits from the Department for the week ending 8/18/2018.

**CONCLUSION OF LAW:** Section 443.111(4), Florida Statutes provides in relevant part:

WEEKLY BENEFIT FOR UNEMPLOYMENT.--

- (a) *Total.*--Each eligible individual who is totally unemployed in any week is paid for the week a benefit equal to her or his weekly benefit amount.
- (b) *Partial.*--Each eligible individual who is partially unemployed in any week is paid for the week a benefit equal to her or his weekly benefit less that part of the earned income, if any, payable to her or him for the week which is in excess of 8 times the federal hourly minimum wage. These benefits, if not a multiple of \$1, are rounded downward to the nearest full dollar amount.

The record shows that the claimant's weekly benefit amount is \$275. The employer argued the claimant was separated from the client on 9/5/2018. The employer did not receive any notification from the client on the actual separation date. The claimant provided competent evidence he was separated on 7/23/2018. The employer provided payments that were made to the claimant on 8/3/2018, 8/20/2018 and 9/5/2018. The employer argued that these payments were wages. The hearing officer finds that these were not wages earned from employment. The hearing officer finds the claimant separated from the client company on 7/23/2018. He was not working nor providing services for the client company since 7/23/2018. These payments were for paid time off, vacation, and equipment damage that was earned by the claimant prior to his separation date of 7/23/2018. Therefore, under the law the claimant did not earn any wages from this employer from 7/29/2018 to 11/10/2018. He is eligible be for his full benefit amount of \$275 for each week in the time period from 7/29/2018 to 11/10/2018. The week ending 7/28/2018 is moot as the claimant filed his initial claim on 7/30/2018 which is for the weeks starting 7/29/2018.

The law provides that a claimant who was not entitled to benefits received must repay the overpaid benefits to the Department. The law does not permit waiver of recovery of overpayments. The entry into evidence of a transaction history generated by a personal identification number establishing that a certification or claim for one or more weeks of benefits was made against the benefit account of the individual, together with documentation that payment was paid by a state warrant made to the order of the person or by direct deposit via electronic means, constitutes prima facie evidence that the person claimed and received reemployment assistance benefits from the state.

The claimant was entitled to his full benefit amount of \$275 for the week ending 8/18/2018, therefore he does not have an overpayment for that week.

**DECISION:** The determination dated 9/28/2018 is **REVERSED**. The claimant is eligible for his full benefit amount of \$275 for each week in the time period from 7/29/2018 to 11/10/2018. He does not have an overpayment the week ending 8/18/2018.

NOTE: The week ending 7/28/2018 is moot. The claimant did not file his initial claim for benefits until 7/30/2018.

If this decision disqualifies and/or holds the claimant ineligible for benefits already received, the claimant will be required to repay those benefits. The specific amount of any overpayment will be calculated by the department and set forth in a separate overpayment determination, unless specified in this decision. However, the time to request review of this decision is as shown above and is not stopped, delayed or extended by any other determination, decision or order.

However, the time to request review of this decision is as shown above and is not stopped, delayed or extended by any other determination, decision or order.

**A party who did not attend the hearing for good cause may request reopening, including the reason for not attending, at [connect.myflorida.com](https://connect.myflorida.com) or by writing to the address at the top of this decision. The date of the confirmation page will be the filing date of a request for reopening on the Department's Web Site.**

A party who attended the hearing and received an adverse decision may file a request for review to the Reemployment Assistance Appeals Commission, Suite 101 Rhyne Building, 2740 Centerview Drive, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-4151; (Fax: 850-488-2123); <https://raaciap.floridajobs.org>. If mailed, the postmark date will be the filing date. If faxed, hand-delivered, delivered by courier service other than the United States Postal Service, or submitted via the Internet, the date of receipt will be the filing date. To avoid delay, include the docket number and the last five digits of the claimant's social security number. A party requesting review should specify any and all allegations of error with respect to the referee's decision, and provide factual and/or legal support for these challenges. Allegations of error not specifically set forth in the request for review may be considered waived.

There is no cost to have a case reviewed by the Commission, nor is a party required to be represented by an attorney or other representative to have a case reviewed. The Reemployment Assistance Appeals Commission has not been fully integrated into the Department's CONNECT system. While correspondence can be mailed or faxed to the Commission, no correspondence can be submitted to the Commission via the CONNECT system. All parties to an appeal before the Commission must maintain a current mailing address with the Commission. A party who changes his/her mailing address in the CONNECT system must also provide the updated address to the Commission, in writing. All correspondence sent by the Commission, including its final order, will be mailed to the parties at their mailing address on record with the Commission.
