## - Highlights of the Survey -

his survey collected information on an estimated 787 job vacancies in 147 different occupations in the region that encompasses Okaloosa and Walton counties.

The largest concentrations of job vacancies were found in Healthcare Practitioners and Technical occupations (162 vacancies, 20.6 percent); Food Preparation and Serving Workers occupations (127 vacancies, 16.1 percent); Sales and Related occupations (79 vacancies, 10.1 percent); and Office and Administrative Support Workers occupations (72 vacancies, 9.1 percent).

Family and General Practitioners were among the top paying jobs at \$85.75 per hour; Education Administrators, Elementary and Secondary at \$56.64 per hour; Industrial Production Managers at \$52.39 per hour; Marketing Managers at \$49.65 per hour; and Transportation, Storage, and Distribution Managers at \$44.53 per hour.

### **Length of Vacancies**

- Regional employers filled 82.7 percent of their vacancies in less than 30 days.
- Exactly 10.3 percent of vacancies were in continual recruitment.

# Certification/License Requirements, Full-Time/Part-Time Status

- Certification or Licenses were required for 32.3 percent of the reported vacancies in the region.
- Full-time jobs accounted for 64.4 percent of the vacancies in the region.

#### **Benefits**

- Nearly 44 percent of the reported job vacancies in the region offered a full benefits package, including health insurance, paid sick leave, paid vacation time, and pension/retirement savings plan.
- Approximately 69 percent of the reported vacancies in the region offered one or more of the four benefits.

#### **Employer Future Hiring Plans**

Okaloosa Walton Workforce Development Board employers plan to hire 238 Food Preparation and Serving Workers in the next year. Okaloosa Walton Workforce Development Board employers also indicated they plan to hire 141 Waiters and Waitresses; 52 Retail Salespersons; 39 Cooks; 33 Cashiers; 26 Maids and Housekeeping Cleaners; and 22 Bartenders in the next year.

#### Methodology

he Job Vacancy/Hiring Needs Survey for the area consisted of Okaloosa and Walton counties in the Northwest Florida region for a total of 1,299 area employers. The survey was conducted to identify job vacancies to assist in the reemployment of workers.

The survey was conducted in December 2009 using a probability sample of local employers stratified by industry supersector and size class.

Final survey results had a response rate of over 87 percent of the original sample. A total of 787 vacancies were estimated across all selected industry sectors.

The largest numbers of job vacancies were found within the Registered Nurses occupations; Waiter and Waitresses occupations; Cashier occupations; and Food Preparation and Serving Workers occupations.



### **Education and Training**



- More than 81 percent of the job vacancies had some level of education requirement.
- Nearly 56 percent of the vacancies in the region required education beyond high school, including Associate's degrees, Bachelor's degrees or postsecondary vocational training.
- Nearly 29 percent of the vacancies required a Bachelor's degree or higher.



- A majority of the job vacancies (70.8 percent) had some level of experience requirement.
- Nearly 25 percent of all job vacancies required 3 years or more of experience.
