SUBJECT: Lower Living Standard Income Level (LLSIL) and Federal Poverty Guidelines for 2007

PURPOSE

The purpose for the following table is to provide basic income levels used in determining eligibility for participants in various state and federally funded programs. These levels may be used to further meet any income level needs used in prioritizing limited availability of services by the Regional Workforce Boards (RWBs).

ACTION REQUIRED

These guidelines should be used in determining if an individual meets the definition of low income. Regional Workforce Boards are encouraged to provide this information to all associates and interested parties.

The RWBs which contain the following counties are required to use the Metro data: Escambia, Santa Rosa, Okaloosa, Bay, Gadsden, Leon, Clay, Duval, Nassau, St. Johns, Alachua, Marion, Flagler, Volusia, Lake, Orange, Osceola, Seminole, Brevard, Polk, Hernando, Hillsborough, Pasco, Pinellas, Manatee, Sarasota, Charlotte, Lee, Collier, Martin, St. Lucie, Palm Beach, Broward and Miami-Dade. The remaining RWBs may use either the Metro or Non-Metro. Where the poverty level for a particular family size is greater than the corresponding LLSIL figure, the Metro or Non-Metro figure is indicated in parentheses. The 100 percent table for the LLSIL may be modified to calculate any locally determined values for prioritizing service or eligibility (i.e. 200% of LLSIL would multiply the 100% value times 2 for the appropriate family size).
