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## **Florida's August Unemployment Rate Reflects Little Change**

*~ Job growth was lead by the leisure and hospitality industries ~*

**TALLAHASSEE** – Florida Agency for Workforce Innovation (AWI) Director Monesia T. Brown today announced Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased from 3.9 percent in July 2007 to 4.0 percent in August 2007. Based on the latest nationwide data, Florida had the lowest unemployment rate of the ten most populous states and continued to be below the national average. The comparable national unemployment rate for August was 4.6 percent. Out of the civilian labor force of 9,225,000, there were 370,000 jobless Floridian's, up 6,000 (1.6 percent) over the month.

August reflected a slight decrease in the job growth rate. However, Florida's annual job growth rate was 1.5 percent in August, which was slightly faster than the national rate of 1.2 percent. Nonagricultural employment increased over the month by 3,000 to a total of 8,143,800 jobs. Based on the latest nationwide data, Florida ranked third in job growth among the ten most populous states, behind Texas and California. From August 2006 to August 2007, job growth was led by the leisure and hospitality industry (+35,700 jobs) and the education and health industry (+35,000 jobs).

Florida's Annual Workforce Estimating Conference, which was chaired by the legislature in August, met to identify high-skill, high-wage occupations. For the Conference, the Agency for Workforce Innovation's Labor Market Statistics Center projected that Florida will gain almost 1.36 million jobs between 2007 and 2015 (1.89 percent annual growth).

"As the challenges of our economy present themselves, it is vitally important that we remain proactive," said Director Brown. "The forecasting process of the Workforce Estimating Conference allows us to do just that by identifying Florida's long-term employment needs and aligning or adjusting our services accordingly. The result is a nationally recognized workforce system poised to positively respond to the needs of Florida's working public."

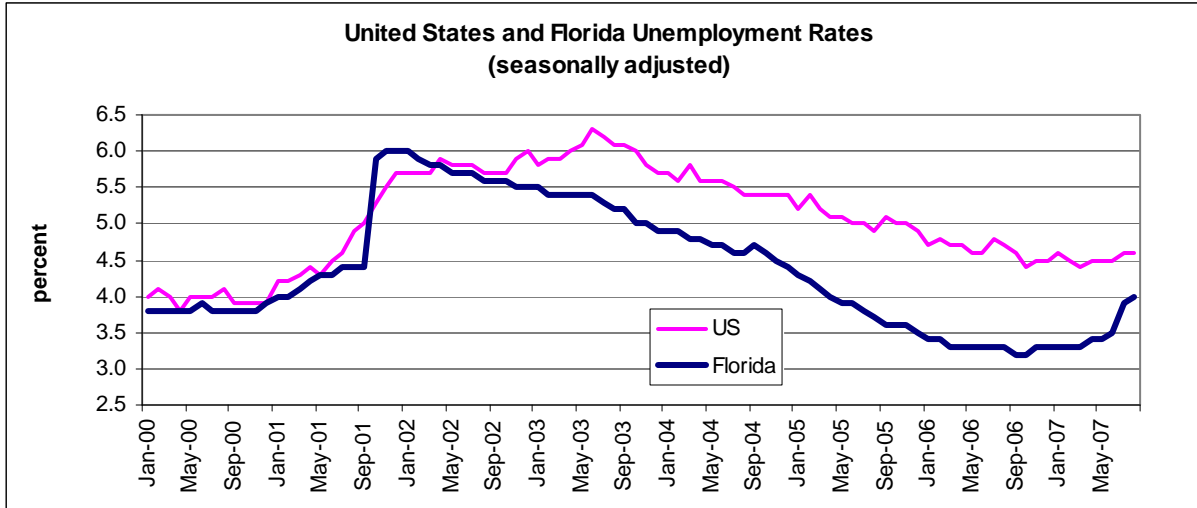
Employment projections for 2007 to 2015 released by the Agency during this year's Conference indicate that all of Florida's major industry sectors will see employment gains, except agriculture and mining. Pharmaceuticals, medical instruments and some construction-related manufacturing industries will continue to be critical to modest growth in Manufacturing; however, this industry will see the slowest growth in new jobs. Retail trade will see strong gains in general merchandise stores, motor vehicle dealers and building material stores as each continues to expand. The information sector will be driven by gains in software publishing, wireless telecommunications and Internet-related service providers.

Additionally, financial services growth will be slowed by the current downturn in mortgage lending, causing the industry to grow slower than the average for all industries. Declines in construction for the short-term will result in fewer new jobs and slower growth in this industry in the long-term. Growth in employment services, legal, engineering, computer design and consulting services will make professional and business services the fastest growing industry sector. Educational services, both private and public, will have 63 percent of its job growth occur in the elementary and secondary schools. However, in general, the occupations growing the fastest will require higher levels of education and training in order to meet the needs of Florida's businesses.

## Florida's Labor Market at a Glance (Seasonally Adjusted)

- Florida's economy continued to slow in August, with an unemployment rate higher than a year ago and a job growth rate just above the national average.
- Florida's August 2007 unemployment rate of 4.0 percent was the highest since April 2005 when it was also 4.0 percent. This rate was 0.6 percentage point lower than the national rate of 4.6 percent. Florida's rate has been below the national average since mid-2002.
- Florida gained 119,500 nonagricultural jobs in August compared to a year ago. Florida has recorded 60 consecutive months of job growth.



## Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- Florida added 119,500 jobs since August 2006. Leisure and hospitality (+35,700 jobs, +3.9 percent) and education and health services (+35,000 jobs, +3.6 percent) accounted for 59 percent of the new jobs in the state.
- Government ranked third among Florida's major industries in job growth, expanding by 22,700 jobs over the year (+2.1 percent). Local government accounted for 86 percent of the total increase in government.
- Trade, transportation, and utilities increased by 19,500 jobs over August 2006 levels (+1.2 percent). Retail trade accounted for the majority of the growth.
- Construction employment, reacting to declines in the housing market, lost 18,500 jobs over the year (-2.9 percent). It was the first time since 1992 that the state has experienced six consecutive months of over-the-year declines in construction jobs.
- Manufacturing (-4,300 jobs, -1.1 percent) and information (-3,800 jobs, -2.3 percent) continued to have over-the-year declines, mainly due to weakness in computer and electronic product manufacturing, wired telecommunications, broadcasting, and food manufacturing.

## Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In August 2007, Walton County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (2.4 percent), followed by Lafayette, Liberty, Monroe, and Okaloosa counties (3.0 percent each). Alachua and Wakulla counties followed, both with unemployment rates of 3.1 percent.
- Hendry County, at 9.8 percent, had the highest unemployment rate in Florida in August, followed by Indian River County (6.8 percent), St. Lucie County (6.7 percent), Glades County (6.2 percent), and Okeechobee County (6.1 percent). Hendry County's relatively high unemployment rate was due to seasonal declines in agriculture and related industries.

## **Area Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Not Seasonally Adjusted)**

- The Miami-Ft. Lauderdale-Pompano Beach Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) led the state in over-the-year employment gains (+37,000 jobs, +1.5 percent) in August 2007, followed by the Orlando-Kissimmee MSA (+29,600 jobs, +2.7 percent) and the Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater MSA (+15,300 jobs, +1.2 percent). The combined employment growth in these three MSAs accounted for 68 percent of the total job growth in the state.
