Pursuant to sections 112.0441(4) and 381.00317(6), Florida Statutes, the Department is not required to make findings of an immediate danger to the public, health, safety, or welfare as all conditions are deemed met to adopt emergency rules pursuant to section 120.54(4), Florida Statutes.

## STATEMENT OF AGENCY REASONS THAT PROCEDURE IS FAIR UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES

Pursuant to sections 112.0441(4) and 381.00317(6), Florida Statutes, the procedures are deemed fair under the circumstances.

In addition to the standards listed in section 443.101(2), Florida Statutes, the following criteria will apply. Work will not be considered suitable if:

- (1) The work is for an educational institution, as that term is defined in section 112.0441(1)(b), Florida Statutes, or a governmental entity, as that term is defined in section 768.38, Florida Statutes, and the educational institution or governmental entity imposes a COVID-19 vaccination mandate as a condition of employment.
- (2) The work is for a private employer that imposes a COVID-19 vaccination mandate as a condition of employment, and the private employer does not offer the exemptions listed in section 381.00317(1). Florida Statutes. Rulemaking Authority sections 381.00317(6)(b) and 112.0441(4). Florida Statutes. Laws Implemented sections 381.00317(5)(b)2. and 112.0441(3)(b)2. Florida Statutes. History-New.
