North Port received the first tranche of American Rescue Plan Act Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds on June 7, 2021. The first tranche was for \$4,213,679.50. City Commission determined that the first tranche will be used for the water and sewer expansion recommendations in the Economic Development Market Feasibility Study. This project is one of the recommendations. The funds will be available on October 1, 2021.






