The initial phase included constructing portions of the roads and utilities to make the site immediately available. The county, in partnership with the land owner, secured the first tenant of the FCCP, Dollar Tree International (DTI). DTI purchased 200 acres of the park, built its initial phase of a 500,000 square feet logistics facility, and is nearing completion on an additional 1,470,347 square feet. The DTI facility opened in August			
2021 with over 250 jobs and anticipates an additional 500 jobs by 2024.			
The county has continued to make infrastructure improvements inside the park, extending SW 49th Avenue to the northern (Segment A) and southern (Segments E2 & F) areas of the park. Construction is to commence on			
both of these phases in calendar year 2024. The roads are designed to provide relief to I-75 traffic and a more direct connection for area residents and commerce park access to the City of Ocala. The park continues to gain attention and interest from other national companies; the County and Ocala/Marion County Chamber and Economic Partnership (CEP) are fielding inquiries on a weekly basis. Yes	Marion County was one of the most severely impacted counties in the state by the Great Recession, with an unemployment rate that peaked at 14.4%, however, it has since strongly recovered. The recovery was led by the		
	attraction and expansion of targeted industries with companies such as FedEx, AutoZone, Chewy, Mestizo Foods, eResources, and Dollar Tree International, among others, choosing to locate new facilities in the community. These companies have invested more than \$400 million and created more than 4,500 new jobs with wages that met or exceeded the area's targeted wages. FedEx, AutoZone, and Chewy are all located in the		

Ocala/Marion County Commerce Park (OMCCP), where the last parcel was recently sold for development. Following the success of the OMCCP, the FCCP already has multiple tenants, with less than half of its land left for development. With the final buildout, FCCP will replicate the same successes as the OMCCP in Marion Oaks, an area that did not experience the same level of job creation during the county's economic recovery.

The Marion Oaks community is located in Southwest Marion County, with the FCCP located nearly in the middle. Census data shows the median household income in Marion Oaks is more than \$7,000 a year lower than the state average. Additionally, according to data from ESRI, there are more than 50,000 residents within a five-mile radius of this site but only 4,000 jobs. As a result, many of the residents must commute 30 minutes or more on already congested I-75 to reach employment opportunities (FDOT I-75 Task Force). The development of this site will increase employment opportunities close to home for thousands of residents, raise the wages

Based on the site's successful review by JM Mullis, Inc., the following industries are being targeted for recruitment: Food Distribution, Consumer Product Distribution, E-Commerce Distribution, Food Manufacturing, and

FCCP represents one of Florida's largest, strategically located, and truly shovel-ready parks. FCCP offers 200+ acre parcels that are in demand for the one million square feet and larger facilities. These infrastructure improvements inside the FCCP, located off of I-75 in the heart of north-central Florida, provide the resources required for larger facilities. The ability to quickly get a project permitted and under construction was a key to the success of the OMCCP, and continues to be a success for the FCCP. We anticipate at buildout to see the creation of more than 2,600 jobs with over three million square feet of new construction. DTI completed construction of the initial phase of its 500,000 square feet facility in 2021. With phase one, which included the widening of a portion of 484, the construction of two road segments within the FCCP, and the extension of water and sewer utilities, the county committed over \$25 million in addition to the \$5.5 million grant from the state and the donation of land by the McGinley family valued at close to \$1 million. More than \$15 million is being invested during the county's latest phase of design and construction.


The current phase completes one north/south internal road, extending outside the park. The road supported by this grant application will make the southern portion of the park fully accessible. Concurrently, the developer

The county's overall investment totals over \$40 million to date. So far, this investment facilitated the construction of one of the largest buildings in the county, DTI, a facility that has generated over 750 jobs and \$200

Marion County is currently in design with construction commencing in 2024 to complete the north/south road segment (segments A, E2, F) at a cost of \$15 million; the budget has already been approved by the Marion

County Board of County Commissioners and became available Oct 1, 2023. Upon award and receipt of a grant for segment D, design will commence immediately, taking approximately six months; permitting with SWFWMD for the environmental resource permit will overlap with design; bidding for construction and construction will take approximately eight months. The total project is expected to take 14 months from start to

million in private investment. With the additional occupants, nearly \$42 million of private investments will have been brought to the FCCP and Marion County.





Utility Improvements Florida Crossroads Commerce Park (McGinley Property)

Building off the first phase of the DEO Grant to provide service to the Florida Crossroads Commerce Park which is a property contained within the Marion County Utilities service territory where the County intends to serve the development with both central water and wastewater service. Within the first phase of the DEO Grant, central water and sewer infrastructure was extended to portions of the property and the County extended both water and wastewater infrastructure along CR 484 which can now serve as a match for the second phase of the DEO Grant.

Phase 2 of the DEO Grant will require on-site and off-site water main and forcemain extensions to continue to develop the infrastructure for the utility system to provide service. Below is a summary of the existing systems and the additional infrastructure that are needed to support the Phase 2 DEO Grant.

Potable Water:

Phase 1 of the DEO Grant provided extension of both the central water system and the wastewater system on FCCP Road within the Florida Crossroads Commerce Park and Marion County installed infrastructure on CR 484 to support the Phase I DEO Grant Project. The Phase 2 DEO Grant will include water system improvements:

Segment D - 3,460 LF of 12" water main from the FCCP Road (Segment C2) east to 49th
Avenue. Estimated \$486,563.

Total Water Improvements including Design, Permitting and Construction \$486,563.

Sanitary Sewer:

Phase 1 of the DEO Grant provided extension of both the central water system and the wastewater system on FCCP Road within the Florida Crossroads Commerce Park and Marion County installed infrastructure on CR 484 to support the Phase I DEO Grant Project. There are no "downstream" lift stations that would be impacted by this project. However, a connection from this development will require a pumping station to be constructed by future development in the Park. The Phase 2 DEO Grant will include wastewater system improvements:

• Segment D - 3,460 LF of 12" forcemain to connect the southern portion of FCCP Road (Segment C2) and will be extended east to 49th Avenue. Estimated \$486,563.

Total Sewer Improvements including Design, Permitting and Construction \$973,126

The above construction costs do not include Marion County capacity charges associated with connections.

It is my pleasure to write a letter of support for the Florida Jobs Growth Grant Fund proposal, "Florida Crossroads Commerce Park (FCCP)" being submitted by the Marion County Board of County Commissioners.

This project addresses several infrastructure improvements needed to meet the requirements of future industrial development at a highly sought-after location in Marion County.
