

1. Program Requirements:

A. Provide the title and a detailed description of the proposed workforce training:

iTECH Glades Technical College, a five-county initiative including Glades, Hendry, Highlands, Okeechobee, and Collier County School Districts, is requesting a Florida Jobs Growth Grant to seed the opening and the five-year startup costs of the Glades County Regional Training Center located at 1030 Industrial Drive, Moore Haven, FL. This will become a branch campus of the Immokalee Technical College which will be fully accredited as a public technical college with the Council on Occupational Education (COE). This branch campus is located 48 driving miles from the main campus and is centered in a rural area of the state that currently does not have any post-secondary training within 30 miles. See map below.



The Glades County Regional Training Center was constructed in 2014-2015, funded by legislative appropriation and matched by local funding. When funded it was expected to be operated via a consortium of three state colleges, Career Source Southwest Florida, and under the auspices of the Glades County Government. Despite nearly three years of focus groups which identified diesel mechanics, welding and machining, among others, as much needed training for existing manufacturing businesses in the six-county Heartland Region and transferrable skills for targeted industry recruitment in advanced manufacturing and global logistics, those involved ultimately concluded that operation of the facility needed to be transferred to an existing institution that has the knowledge and track record to open and run the center successfully.

In 2018, Glades County approached the Collier County School District to consider taking over and operating the center as a branch campus of the successful Immokalee Technical College (iTECH). Collier County Public Schools have fully agreed to the terms and conditions of this proposal and are committed to the long-term operation and sustainability of this new branch campus after the seed grant sunsets.

The initial offerings at iTECH Glades will include 12 locally targeted occupations from the 2 surrounding Workforce Regions, region 19 and 24. All program offerings will lead to Post-Secondary Adult Vocational (PSAV) Certificates in addition to preparing graduates for state and national credentials. Nine out of the twelve targeted training programs will be completed in a year or less, allowing iTECH Glades to produce skilled workers to enter to the local workforce very quickly. The remaining three high-skilled, high- wage training programs will continue to support the need for regional Workforce Targeted Occupations in the areas of Diesel Technicians, HVAC Technicians, and Licensed Practical Nurses.

This multi-county collaborative venture will give iTECH Glades the ability to serve a population that has historically seen limited access to post-secondary training by providing transferable and sustainable technical skills necessary to excel in the regional workforce. iTECH Glades will become the first public technical college to be operated by a school board outside of its county borders in this exciting regional approach for workforce training. We have tentative Memorandums of Understanding between the Collier County School District and Glades County Government for a 40-year in-kind lease agreement for use of the facility. This proposal is supported by all four county school districts who will benefit from this exciting and groundbreaking collaboration. (See letters of support from surrounding county superintendents). Collier County Public Schools have a proven track record of providing successful post-secondary workforce training and have the capacity and expertise to fill the need for technical training for the south-central rural area of opportunity.

The state of Florida reported the unemployment rates in May 2021 as follows:

B. Describe how this proposal supports programs at state colleges or state technical centers:

This branch campus operates under the direct supervision of the Dept. of Education. iTECH Glades will be a public branch of an established and accredited public technical college, Immokalee Technical College, providing career training for an underserved often transportation disadvantaged population in the Rural Heartland of Florida, effectively becoming Florida's newest technical college. Currently, there are limited opportunities within a 30-mile radius of the Glades County Regional Training Center for adults to gain

technical skills, employability traits and career training. iTECH Glades will carry the same mission and vision of iTECH while adhering to all the local, state and federal guidelines and statutes.

PSAV Certificated programs can be articulated into college credit through the Gold Standard Career Pathways Articulation Agreements of Industry Certification to AAS/AS Degree and established statewide articulation agreements. These agreements on the local and state level will allow students to apply their technical certificates towards college credits and promote further education. Please see table 1 for current statewide articulations in place.

C. <u>Describe how this proposal provides participants transferable, sustainable workforce skills applicable to more than a single employer.</u>

Students enrolling in these programs will gain sustainable and transferable skills to support their success in the workforce. Programs offered at the new center are on the targeted occupations list of three surrounding workforce regions. Immokalee Technical College has strong reputation for developing employer partnerships with all potential benefactors in its region including over 240 employer partners who actively advise, support, and provide placement for our completers. We are expanding our Heartland employer partnerships in order to better address the needs of the region. We have already received very strong support for this project from businesses including:

Programs proposed at iTECH Glades are all designed to assist students in developing transferable and sustainable workforce skills needed on the State and/or Regional Targeted Occupations Lists, and support high-skilled positions for targeted industries, including manufacturing and global logistics. These careers are in high demand and offer competitive wages for candidates who have completed technical training and possess the transferable skills necessary in today's workforce. The proposed 12 day time and evening PSAV certificated programs will include:

- Diesel Systems Technician
- Heating, Ventilation, Air-Conditioning/Refrigeration (HVAC/R)
- Practical Nursing
- Accounting Operations
- Medical Administrative Specialist
- Legal Administrative Specialist
- Correctional Office
- Commercial Vehicle Driving
- Commercial Class "B" Driving
- Nursing Assistant
- Welding Technology
- Professional Culinary Arts and Hospitality

Since this proposal is built on the efforts of regional collaboration and partnerships, iTECH Glades will be able to assist the workforce and labor market by directly increasing the population of skilled workers in the region. To further assist a new and existing workforce in the region, iTECH Glades will also develop and offer continuing workforce and community education short-term training and apprentice programs. Examples include:

Continuing Workforce Training:

- Microsoft Office Suite and QuickBooks
- OSHA Training

With the addition of a technical college, businesses will be more likely to establish a footprint in the area because of the college's proximity to train local talent. This facility is an enormous selling point for businesses looking to move to or start-up in the area. Immokalee Technical College already has a strong body of existing partnerships and strengthening this network with the addition of neighboring school districts, economic development professionals, county managers, and workforce boards will enable iTECH Glades to produce a sustainable skilled workforce to serve the unmet need for several regional and future regional employers.

D. <u>Describe how this proposal supports a program(s) that is offered to the public:</u>

iTECH Glades, branch campus of the Immokalee Technical College is a public college. All programming is open to the public. Additionally, short-term and continuing education courses will be available to meet the needs of the workforce and employer partners. As a branch campus of Immokalee Technical College, iTECH Glades will offer Federal Pell Grants for eligible students along with workforce training funds from local agencies such as CareerSource and the Farm Worker Career Development Program. The new center will impact over 250 people annually increasing their chances to obtain high-skilled high-wage employment. The District School Board does not discriminate on the basis of sex or disability in the education programs and activities that it operates, pursuant to the requirements of Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, respectively.

E. <u>Describe how this proposal is based on criteria established by the state colleges and state technical centers:</u>

Collier County Schools has the authority from the state to open and operate this branch campus:

F.S. 1001.44 Career centers. —

(1) DISTRICT SCHOOL BOARD MAY ESTABLISH OR ACQUIRE CAREER CENTERS.— Any district school board, after first obtaining the approval of the Department of Education, may, as a part of the district school system, organize, establish and operate a career center, or acquire and operate a career center previously established.

Programming follows Florida Department of Education (DOE) frameworks offering state certificates and industry credentialing. The programs that will be offered at iTECH Glades are supported by the DOE, and curriculum frameworks guide instructors and students through Occupational Completion Points established through a curriculum review team of educators and industry leaders. As students' progress through courses within the programs, they will gain sustainable and transferable technical skills to support their entrance into the workforce. They will also, in many cases, earn industry and state or national certifications.

F. <u>Does this proposal support a program(s) that will not exclude unemployed or underemployed individuals?</u>

Yes- this is a public, open access, post-secondary institution.

G. Describe how this proposal will promote economic opportunity by enhancing workforce training. Please include the number of program completers anticipated to be created from the proposed training. Further, please include the economic impact on the community, region, or state and the associated metrics used to measure the success of the proposed training.

This region has never had adequate access to workforce training. This initiative will effectively open Florida's newest public technical college which will dramatically increase the economic opportunities by providing a skilled workforce that is targeted specifically to the needs of the community. This region has already identified over 5,000 annual job openings in the programs that we are proposing this project. It will have a tremendous impact of reducing the skills gap and will transform the lives of the people of the region it serves.

Opening this branch campus will entice businesses interested in developing in the region that there is a viable and skilled workforce available. Students who graduate will enjoy the benefits of high-skill high-wage employment while graduating debt free. Imagine the impact that this campus will have to the unemployment rates in the region, which includes some of the state's highest unemployment rates.

We will measure the success of branch campus through student program completion rates, employment placement data, and state and national licensure data. We will track all graduates and collect this data for three years following graduation. This data is required and reported annually to our main accrediting body, the Council on Occupational Education (COE). Currently the main campus has a proven track record approaching 95% program completions and 84% job placement rates school wide and 84% licensure rate.

2. Additional Information

A. Is this an expansion of an existing training program?

No, this request is to open a brand-new branch campus. This branch campus will serve a new geographic location whose population has lacked access and resources to obtain quality post-secondary workforce training. The building already exists through a collaboration of state and local government, along with private funding resources.

B. Does the proposal align with Florida's Targeted Industries?

Yes, iTECH Glades will provide high skilled training for Florida's targeted industries. Among the many training programs proposed with a strong emphasis in manufacturing cluster including diesel technician, HVAC, welding, and food and beverage production and much needed health occupational training. We will build on the core curriculum as outlined in this grant application and expect to continue to grow our programs to better serve existing and targeted industries in the Florida Heartland Economic Region of Opportunity (FHERO) region, while establishing and growing the talent pipeline for those industries.

C. <u>Does the proposal align with an occupation(s) on the Statewide Demand Occupations List and/or Regional Demand Occupations List?</u>

Yes, all programs were thoroughly vetted and are on statewide and/or regional demand occupation list. Eleven out of twelve proposed training programs are identified on both associated workforce development regions with proximity to the campus. See table 2 below which details each program and how it is associated with regional targeted demand occupations lists from associated regions. This table also show annual openings within the

iTECH Glades will be taught in person in traditional classroom and lab-based delivery models housed at the Glades Regional Training Facility.

E. <u>Indicate the number of anticipated annual enrolled students and completers in the proposed program(s).</u>

We anticipate an annual enrollment of 250 students. The main campus has a ten-year history of at or near 90% completion rate. We are using this historical data to estimate completion rates at the branch campus of at or near 90% which will result in 225 students completing annually. See table 3 below:

G. <u>Describe the plan to support the sustainability of the program after grant completion.</u>

Collier County Public Schools have fully agreed to the terms and conditions of this proposal and are committed to the long-term operation and sustainability of this new branch campus after the seed grant sunsets. The District has agreed with the Glades County Board of County Commissioners, who owns the Glades County Commission Training Center, for the in-kind use of the facility in perpetuity including the maintenance of the facility for the first five years of operations. iTECH Glades will begin earning workforce funding generated by seat time which will allow for the sustainability after the grant sunsets. EQUIPMENT:

• Classroom and Lab FF & E: \$785,000 has been budgeted for equipment and furniture. Immokalee Technical College has researched and determined the cost of equipment to set up and operate in the existing facility. The detail of the equipment for all programing and administrative operations is listed in the table above. The equipment needed to provide this training has been determined based on past practices of the college and through business partner advisement. The purchase of this equipment is critical for both the creation of the branch campus and to the hands-on approach to career and technical training. We would begin purchasing equipment that will be located in existing training space upon the award of the grant. We will purchase the additional equipment for the new training classrooms and lab spaces as soon as that space is built out.

PERSONNEL:

- Salaries: \$4,336,838 has been budgeted for personnel. We have determined that we will require 1 branch campus administrator, 1 full-time advisor, 6 full-time instructors, additional adjunct instructors, 2 teacher assistants, 1 office manager, and 3 additional clerical staff to support the identified programing and to effectively operate a full service branch campus. The detail of the cost for personnel is identified in the table above.
 - Indirect Costs within Salaries Total: \$180,000 has been budgeted.

FACILITIES:

- Facilities Capital Costs and Operating Costs: \$2,273,805 has been budgeted for addition training space within the shelled area of the center. There will remain substantial space under roof that will be left for future growth. The table and diagram on the following pages details the capital improvement plans.
- Operating Costs within Facilities Total:
 - **Utilities**: \$245,000 has been identified as the cost for Internet service, electric, water and sewer, and is based on actual costs with projected increase of use of the facility.
 - **Repairs and Maintenance**: \$50,000 has been identified as a contingency for possible needed maintenance and repairs.
 - **Student Medical and Liability & Contents Insurance**: \$50,000 has been identified as for the cost of student medical liability and contents insurance based on current projections.
 - Marketing: \$50,000 has been budgeted to allow for \$10,000 annually to do effective outreach and marketing of the new branch campus.

TUITION:

• **Tuition:** \$30,000 has been budgeted for gap funding for tuition. We anticipate over 85% of our students to receive Federal, State, and local scholarships. This is based on historic data from our main campus.

TRAINING MATERIALS:

- **Supplies**: \$100,000 has been budgeted to allow for \$20,000 annually for supplies for the operation of the facility.
- **Software**: \$50,000 has been budgeted to allow for \$10,000 annually for various software licenses need for operations and training.




