Tallahassee Community College (TCC) is a recognized regional leader in innovative workforce development programs. We offer programs on TCC's main campus, at the Florida Public Safety Institute, and statewide	ies .
through our partnership for workforce development with the Florida Department of Corrections (FDC). These programs include an Associate of Arts degree in Criminal Justice, Florida Correctional Basic Recruit Training, and the Florida Correctional Probation Basic Recruit Training. The programs prepare students for high-demand criminal justice careers as certified corrections and correctional probation officers.	
There is a critical demand for recruiting and retaining qualified, well-trained correctional personnel in Florida. To assist in meeting the increased demand for correctional officers and the development of strategies to	
retain existing officers, for this grant, we propose pursuing a partnership for FDC with a provider of online educational advisement and career success coaching to provide complimentary workforce readiness services to FDC's 24,000 employees, of which 17,000 are correctional officers and their immediate families.	
Contracting with an online provider of educational advisement services and career success coaching presents a unique opportunity to offer a learner experience that moves from initial awareness of available offerings	
through thoughtful intake, action planning and follow-up, ongoing coaching, and successful goal completion. Available providers may address recruitment and retention concerns by providing personalized plans for test preparation, continuing education, career advancement, and exploration of available financial assistance. In conjunction with FDC, the provider may develop a learning scorecard to provide a goal-oriented roadmap to meet career aspirations, yield higher employee retention and competitive compensation, and foster overall career satisfaction.

While tailored to address correctional personnel advancement and retention, the online service provider Success Coaching and Advising Program is not unlike educational advisement services offered throughout the Florida State College and State University systems.	
TCC and FDC will choose an online service provider with a successful record of supporting students seeking higher education, and can also provide career coaching for in-demand jobs. The online service provider will welcome all students who desire to learn, regardless of previous academic experience.
