SUBJECT: Required Limited English Proficiency and Program Accessibility Training

To ensure meaningful access to programs and services for individuals with limited English proficiency and individuals with disabilities, <u>ALL</u> Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) employees, including OPS, must view the Limited English Proficiency and Program Accessibility (LEPPA) training video and acknowledge completion by <u>Friday, May 18, 2018</u>. Employee acknowledgments will be tracked and monitored for compliance by DEO.

The LEPPA training is available but not required for LWDB or career center employees. However, it is recommended that LWDB and career center employees view this training. LWDB or career center employees who are interested in taking the LEPPA training may access the training through the TOPYX Learning Management system by following the attached step-by-step guide.
